	Grab bars have been installed next to toilet and in bath and/or shower.	
	Bath and shower have non-skid surfaces.	
	There is a nightlight.	
	The hot water temperature is set to 120° or below.	
	Floor surfaces are kept dry and clean.	
In the bedroom		
	Furniture is placed where you won't trip over it.	
	Night lighting is adequate.	
	You have a flashlight for emergency use.	
Interior stairs and landings		
	Have handrails on both sides.	
	Have adequate lighting.	
	Have floor coverings in good repair.	
	Are free of clutter.

	Space heaters are used correctly.
